GOOD NEWS CLINICS GETS EVEN BETTER

Good News Clinics has begun providing several new programs and treatments for our patients this year. It is a privilege, for which we owe this community much gratitude, to present in this report the many ways low-income Hall County residents are receiving optimal care through innovative and exciting new programs.

We hope you'll celebrate the successful impact of **201**7 with us as you read the annual report outlining snapshots of this past year.

THE GIFT OF HEALING

"Shirley" has been a patient for four years. In 2013 she went to the E.R. concerned that she had a virus. Immediately she was diagnosed with diabetes and needed gallbladder surgery. Shirley has worked for 22 years with a small packaging company that cannot provide insurance. She makes between \$200-\$300/week. The cost of private insurance is impossible. GNC has become her primary care provider and was able to address her needs. Shirley loves the volunteer physicians who have helped her manage this life-altering disease.

"Antonio" immigrated here from Spain two years ago after struggling to maintain employment in the economically strained city of Madrid. Debt and unemployment had hit an all time high and he immigrated seeking new opportunities in Gainesville. His income as a day laborer is about \$200-\$250/week. He and his wife are able to receive much needed dental and medical at GNC. Once housing, utilities, and transportation are paid for, there isn't money left for high-priced insurance premiums.

Over 21% of the nearly 197,000 Hall County residents do not have health insurance. In the hierarchy of needs, housing, food, clothing, and transportation come first. Many go without health and dental care because they cannot afford it. GNC is able to stand in the gap because our community sees to it that EVERYONE, not just those with high-paying job opportunities, has medical and dental care options. Medical and dental healthcare providers volunteer time to see patients without other options. Sponsors and donors, NGHS and other agencies help fund the work of the clinics. The Shirleys and Antonios of Hall County make our community better and they couldn't do it without your commitment to their health. Thank you for supporting GNC.

NEW SERVICES YIELD SUCCESS

Bilingual Counseling

Every patient that comes to GNC is screened for depression and anxiety. Many are diagnosed with depression which complicates their medical treatment plan.

Maria Perdomo, GNC Counselor, joined our team as an intern from Brenau University's Clinical Counseling program in 2016. Over the last year, *she has provided and supervised over 958 counseling appointments*.

"I started developing fears and worry about everything. I could not sleep or eat," says one patient. "Counseling has helped me cope with my fear and my life has changed tremendously."

Dietitian Provides Nutrition Counseling

Since GNC hired Karen Hunter, RD, in November 2016, patients have collectively lost over 500lbs! Karen provides nutrition counseling and disease management skills to patients with chronic issues that require special dietary concerns. Diabetics and those suffering from heart failure who may be food insecure can receive prescriptive food boxes from the Georgia Mountains Food Bank. Jubilee Gardens has joined our efforts and provides free produce to our patients. Special lowsodium and diabetic recipes are made available in nutrition classes. By managing weight and dietary needs under our dietitian's care, patients are empowered and experiencing better medical outcomes.

PCOM STUDENTS & GNC'S HEPC CLINIC

Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine's Suwanne campus Doctor of Pharmacy students manage our HepC clinic. Here's a snapshot of the success of this important program:

- **51** patients identified with chronic HepC
- **48** patients have enrolled for treatment
- **38** patients have finished
- **8** patients currently in treatment

Only **2** patients either selfterminated treatment or moved out of state before finishing treatment


Of those who have completed treatment and completed labs to get results, there is a **94% cure rate**

HEP C PROGRAM: SAVING LIVES AND MONEY

Several years ago, there was a recognized need for HepC treatment in our clinic's population. Recent advances for treating HepC have created several options for curing this life -threatening and healthcomplicating virus. The Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) has fourth year Suwanee campus students who partner with the GNC dispensary and physicians to administer the treatment. Under the leadership of Dr. Caroline Champion, these students have enrolled and managed treatment for 48 patients.

The cost of each patient's medications (Harvoni) totals nearly \$100,000 but, through

Gilead Pharmaceutical patient assistance programs, we are able to provide the drugs and GNC provides lab costs of \$668 per patient. The average cost of related complications for HepC patients is \$30,000 in hospital costs annually. This program prevents serious complications, saves both lives and hospital resources.





GNC staff collected \$510.40 in change to benefit the clinics budget.

BRENAU UNIVERSITY HOSTS P.T. CLINIC

Dr. Greg Patterson is a local Home Health Physical Therapist (P.T.) who began seeing GNC patients several years ago. As an adjunct professor in the Doctor of P.T. (D.P.T.) program at Brenau University he saw an opportunity. Second and third year students needed hands on training under the leadership of local Physical Therapists and GNC patients needed more options for physical therapy. In Summer of 2017, the two came together under the leadership of Dr. Mary Thigpen, Brenau Faculty in charge of the Doctor of P.T. program.

Brenau University now hosts a pro-bono P.T. Clinic just for GNC patients. Students are supported by faculty as well as by the local physical therapists in offering 48 P.T. appointments each month. Debilitating back pain, shoulder and neck injuries, and other serious issues are being treated to patients' great relief and satisfaction. Compliance for this program is exceptional.

The 120 Brenau students who are part of this program have or will have provided GNC patient care by the time they graduate. Students have been enthusiastic about the program which they feel serves as reminder that many hardworking, low-income people would go without help for their often painful issues if the P.T. community did not give back. Patients are motivated and incredibly grateful to the students. Students have realized that real life struggles, like transportation to appointments, will affect their practice and they are learning that both giving back and accommodating patient struggles are important to a good practice moving forward.

The first time third year student, Hannah, completed the treatment of her first patient, she cried. She recognized that helping people overcome painful issues that kept them from living full lives was why she started the journey to become a physical therapist.

People like Dr. Greg Patterson, Dr. Mary Thigpen, D.P.T. students, and the local P.T. community who volunteer at the pro-bono clinic are making a huge impact on the lives of GNC patients who want to get back to work and life. The Brenau P.T. clinic has provided 184 appointments since May. On behalf of our patients, thank you Brenau University and all who have offered this care.
